

General Notes:	1. Several of these materials are quite specific and not very replicable. They were deliberately chosen for their unusual / hard-to-describe structures, or to resemble another piece in the same setup. I suggest using similarly-shaped items.						
	2. I've deliberately NOT provided the "Orientation" column so that you can provide variation in your tryouts to prevent exchange of info.						
	2. I highly recommend adding extra pieces to the box of pieces that you provide members. Can use "penalties" of 1 point each (for writing/building with extra pieces).						
	3. This rubric can be used even if you are unable to create a setup, and are having members only Write to describe the Images.						
	4. It is important that if you are selecting Writers and Builders seperately, you grade them seperately. This means that you would grade Writers for how closely their descriptions match the Images, and the Builders for how closely their write-ups match the Writer's instructions, NOT the original Images. It is more effort, but over time you would hone the best Writers AND Builders, especially if both categories have many newbies.
